Texas Temporary License for Charitable Purpose

(For Out-of-State Dentists Volunteering in Texas)

Purpose:

Allows licensed dentists from other U.S. states to provide *volunteer, uncompensated dental care* in Texas during charitable events (e.g., TMOM).

Eligibility

Dentist must:

- Hold a DDS or DMD from an ADA-accredited dental school.
- Be currently licensed in another U.S. state or have held a license in good standing within the last two years.
- Have no disciplinary actions (past or pending).
- Have passed the **National Board Dental Exam** or an equivalent exam.
- Be from a state with licensing requirements similar to Texas.

Restrictions

- May only provide volunteer/charity care (no payment or compensation).
- License is valid **only for the event location and dates** listed in the application.
- May administer local anesthesia only, unless a Texas anesthesia permit is obtained.
- Must have a plan for emergency care, patient records, and continuity of care.

Application Process

1. **Complete** the "**Temporary Licensure for Charitable Purpose**" form from the Texas State Board of Dental Examiners (TSBDE).

2. Include:

- Verification of all dental licenses held (sent directly from licensing boards).
- o NPDB self-query report (sealed, dated within 60 days).

- o Event details: sponsoring organization, location, and dates.
- Description of emergency procedures, patient record system, and follow-up care plan.
- 3. **Submit** the complete packet to TSBDE at least 60 days before the event.
- 4. Await approval before providing any dental services in Texas.

Duration

- Valid **only for the specific charitable event** and timeframe approved by TSBDE.
- Must reapply for each new event.
